

San Diego State Postgame Notes vs. Air Force

Final Score: San Diego State 51, Air Force 38

Team Notes

- San Diego State wins its 12th straight Senior Night game after avenging an early season loss to Air Force.
- The Aztecs won their 19th straight home game, and 18th straight inside Viejas Arena, in the month of March.
- San Diego State is now 44-15 in its last 59 March games.
- SDSU started its four seniors Dakarai Allen, Valentine Izundu, Matt Shrigley and D'Erryl Williams (first career start), along with junior Malik Pope.
- San Diego State held Air Force to 13 first-half points, which is tied for the fourth-fewest points allowed in a first half by the Aztecs since 1996-97.
- The 13 first-half points were the fewest SDSU has allowed in a half since December 22, 2014 vs. UC Riverside (11 in first half).
- SDSU held Air Force to 15.0-percent shooting in the first half, which was the lowest allowed by the Aztecs in the first half since January 19, 2008 vs. Wyoming (3-for-23, 13.0 percent).
- SDSU held Air Force to 38 points, tied for the 12th fewest scored in a game between two Division I teams this year.
- San Diego State held the Falcons to their fewest points of the season (previous low was 58 points).
- The Aztecs held AFA to its second-fewest points in a game in the series.
- SDSU improves to 119-19 in its last 138 games when holding its opponent to 40 percent or less shooting.
- San Diego State improves to 105-4 in its last 109 home games when holding its opponent to 60 points or less.
- The Aztecs are now 55-1 at home in the Steve Fisher era when holding their opponent under 50 points.
- SDSU shot its lowest field goal percentage (28.8) in a win since Nov. 20, 2014 against Cal State Bakersfield (24.6).
- San Diego State has now won four times in the Steve Fisher era when shooting less than 29 percent from the field.
- The Aztecs held Air Force to its lowest field goal percentage (25.0) since shooting 23.8 percent vs. Utah on Jan. 14, 2009 (L, 36-57).
- Two of the four lowest Air Force shooting games since 1996-97 have come against Steve Fisher Aztec coached teams (also Jan. 20, 2001).
- Over the last six games, SDSU has held its opponents to 35.4 percent shooting from the floor, 27.6 from 3-point range and 56.5 points per game.

Combined Team Notes

- The 89 combined points were:
 - tied for the seventh fewest in a SDSU game since 1971
 - tied for the second fewest in an Aztec Mountain West game and fewest since a 55-34 win (also 89 points) vs. New Mexico on Jan. 26, 2013 (SDSU in 3-1 in those games)
 - tied for the third fewest in a game at Viejas Arena (SDSU is 4-0 in those games)

Series Notes

- San Diego State improves to 54-23 all-time vs. Air Force.
- SDSU has won 15 of the last 18 in the series and is 17-4 vs. the Academy since Feb. 6, 2007.
- The Aztecs move to 31-6 all-time vs. the Falcons at home and is 16-3 all-time inside Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State wins its 12th straight home game vs. Air Force.
- SDSU has won at least one game vs. Air Force in 13 consecutive years.

Player Notes

Malik Pope – 11 points, 8 rebounds, 2 blocked shot, 3 assists

Posted his fourth straight game with at least six rebounds... Recorded his fourth straight double-figure scoring game and the 10th of the season (26th career)... He has scored at least seven points in 16 of his 20 games played this season... SDSU is 30-7 in his career when he scores at least eight points and 19-7 when he scores at least 10 points... Led San Diego State in scoring for the 10th time this year and 26th time of his career.

Matt Shrigley - 10 points, 2 rebounds

Made multiple three-pointers to help SDSU improve to 10-2 this season and 31-6 in his career when he makes at least two treys in a game... Reached double figures in scoring for the sixth time this season (SDSU is 6-0 in those games) and for the 21st time of his career (SDSU is 19-2 in those games).

Zylan Cheatham – 8 points, 8 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal

Grabbed at least eight rebounds for the second straight game (9 at Colorado State)... Had three of SDSU's seven first-half field goals.

Trey Kell – 6 points, 12 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals

Set a career high for rebounds in a game with 12 (previous best: 10 at Nevada on Jan. 26, 2016)... Was one rebound short of a SDSU high for the season... Led the team in rebounds for the fourth time this year and seventh time of his career... <u>Had the most rebounds for an Aztec off the bench sine Dwayne Polee II</u> had 12 against St. Katherine's on Dec. 27, 2013 and the most against a Mountain West opponent since Tim Shelton had 12 vs. UNLV on March 7, 2009... Became the only San Diego State player in the last 21 years (since 1996-97) to come off the bench to post a line of at least 6 points, 12 rebounds, 6 assists and 2 steals in the same game... Also became the only player in the country this year to come off the bench and have at least 6 points, 12 rebounds, 6 assists and 2 steals in the same game... Became the first Aztec to post the line of at least 6 points, 12 rebounds, 6 assists and 2 steals in the same game... Became the first Aztec to post the line of at least 6 points, 12 rebounds, 6 assists and 2 reaklin had 12, 14, 4 and 2 vs. Air Force on March 6, 2013.

D'Erryl Williams – 4 points, 3 rebounds, 1 assist, 2 steals

Started for the first time of his career... Was 2-for-2 for the field with four points, three rebounds, one assist and two steals in 21 minutes... His 21 minutes played were one more game than he played as a freshman (20)... The two steals tied a career high.
