Big Notes

- Forward **Jaedon LeDee** scored at least 20 points in a game for the 12th time this season (9-3) and the 15th time in his college career, 14 of his 15 have come while wearing an Aztec uniform.
- San Diego State stands at 58-35 (.624) in Mountain West road games since the start of the 2013-14 season (since the current configuration of the league started), the best winning percentage in the league (No. 2 is Boise State at .516).
- San Diego State fell to 2-1 in over time games this season and is 5-3 in the Brian Dutcher era.
- After shooting a season-best 72.7 percent (8-of-11) from the bonus distance at Air Force, SDSU was a season-worst 15.8 percent 3-of-19 from beyond the arc at Nevada.

Team Notes

- SDSU is now 99-99 all-time in Mountain West road games, the only program to have a league road record of at least .500, which includes a 34-23 record in Mountain West road games under Brian Dutcher.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, SDSU's 75-49 (.605) record in Mountain West road games tops the league and is more than 100 percentage points better than its closest competitor; Boise State which is 51-58 (.468).
- As a ranked team, San Diego State is 4-2 against Nevada and has dropped its last two to the Wolf Pack when it is ranked in the AP top 25. The last time a ranked Aztecs team won at Nevada was 83-76 on Feb. 29, 2020 when SDSU was No. 5 in the nation.
- San Diego State is 95-48 in its last 143 road games against non-AP top 25 teams.

- SDSU has won 43 of its 72 road games (43-29) since Brian Dutcher ascended to the top job for the Aztecs.
- SDSU's bench outscores its opponent's bench for the 16th consecutive game after achieving it in just three of
 its first eight contests.
- SDSU stands at 114-27 under Brian Dutcher and 240-52 in its last 292 games when outscoring the opponent's bench.
- San Diego State trailed 30-27 at the half and is now 22-34 under Brian Dutcher when its opponent has a lead at the intermission.
- SDSU moves to 20-82 in its last 102 games when it trails with five minutes to play in a game.
- SDSU lost the battle of the boards and under Brian Dutcher 38-39 and 78-69 in its last 147 games when it is outrebounded by its opponent.
- Under Brian Dutcher, the Aztecs are 39-9 in games in February and as a program has won 66 of its last 88 (66-22) games in the second month of the year.
- As a program, SDSU is now 255-143 (.641) all-time in Mountain West games.
- The Aztecs move to 44-12 in its last 56 games played on Friday and under Brian Dutcher is 22-7 in games on the day.
- SDSU outscores Nevada in the following situations:
 - 14-10 off the bench

Series Notes

- San Diego State is now 65-25 all-time against Nevada.
- In the Mountain West era, SDSU's record is 35-15 against the Nevada.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher's record against Nevada 13-4, but just 2-5 in games at Lawlor Events Center.
- At Lawlor Events Center, the Aztecs are 6-6, having fallen in each of the last two trips to the facility and as a top 25 teams, SDSU is 4-2 against Nevada, including 1-2 in Lawlor.

Game Flow

- Nevada won the tip.
- Nevada's Jerod Lucas scored the first points of the game on a 3-pointer at 19:45.
- San Diego State's first bucket came at the 17:21 mark on a 3-pointer from Lamont Butler.
- Through the first 8:32, the teams combined to shoot 4-of-18 (.222) from the field.
- San Diego State trailed for the first 33:14 and the game was tied 46-46 with 6:46 to go for the first time since it was 0-0.
- San Diego State took its first lead of the game at the 3:48 mark of the second half on a free throw from Jay Pal as the back half of a traditional 3-point play.
- San Diego State scored the first four points of overtime, but was then outscored by Nevada 10-2 the rest of the way in the four point loss.

Player Notes

Darrion Tramell — 11 points, 4-7 FG, 3-4 FT, 2 rebounds, 4 assists, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the ninth time this season (SDSU is 6-3) and 76th time of his career... Led the team in assists for the eighth and 75th times this year and in his career, respectively.

Jaedon LeDee – 20 points, 4-8 FG, 12-14 FT, 7 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the 23rd time this season in 23 appearances... Now has 42 career double-figure scoring games, 34 of which have come in the 62 games he has played as an Aztec... Led SDSU in scoring for the 16th time this season and 20th time in his career... LeDee finished with at least 20 points for the 12th time in 23 games in 2023-24 and the 15th time in his career... San Diego State lost for the first time this year when LeDee went to the line at least 10 time (7-1).

Micah Parrish – 9 points, 10 rebounds, 4 assists

Reached double figure rebounding for the second time this season and seventh time as a collegiate player... Led the team in assists for the fourth time (3-1) in 2023-24 and for the eighth time in his career (6-2).
