HOW TO SCHEDULE YOUR FILM FESTIVAL EXPERIENCE

There are 23 Wild and Scenic On-Tour films and one local filmmaker film (Seeds, by Garrett Phelps, shown only on Saturday at 6 pm at Town Hall.) We have divided them into three 2-hour film sessions labeled A, B and C. You can watch all 3 sessions in one day or divide them up watching 1 or 2 sessions on Saturday and the rest on Sunday to vary your day with a hike on Volcan Mountain, the Art Photography Wine and Cheese Walk, the Film-Makers Workshop, some unique local shopping, an historical walking tour of Julian and be sure not to forget to save time for a piece of Julian Apple Pie with Cinnamon Ice Cream or a milk shake or Sarsaparilla at the old-fashioned soda fountain across from Town Hall!

PARKING

Town Hall - Free parking is available all around town and there is \$5 all-day parking just West of Main St on 4th Ave between “B” and “C” Streets.
Elementary School – Free parking in the school parking lot with overflow on the street leading up to the school and at the Jr. High School just beyond it.

HIKE VOLCAN MOUNTAIN & SANTA YSABEL PRESERVE EAST

SATURDAY, MAY 5 - 8:30 am, Lead by Laurel and Ron Granquist Santa Ysabel Preserve East on Farmers Road at 8:30 am, Free shuttle van leaves Town Hall at 8:15 am. Santa Ysabel East hike off of Farmer Rd. starts out in lovely open gentle slopes among sycamore and oaks, passing a meadow with cows and their calves grazing. After crossing Santa Ysabel creek, the path starts up a rather steep hill to Kanaka Flat. The Coast to Crest Trail, still in progress, connects up there, where one can see Palomar Observatory. We come back the same way. There will likely be lots of wildflowers along the trail.

SATURDAY, MAY 5 - 1:45 pm, Lead by Sharyl Massey. Volcan/5 Oaks Trail. Meet at the Trailhead sign on Farmers Road. Free shuttle van leaves Town Hall at 1:30 pm, Trail leads past apple orchards up to the beautiful Hubble entry gate. Continue walking uphill on a fire road to the Five Oaks Trail turn-off which is shady with marvelous views to the west. As you cross the fire road, the landscape changes from oaks to a cedar forest. After passing through the mid-summit gate, the trail and landscape changes into wider vistas. Looking east towards the desert and Salton Sea, reflect on the rich history of the roads below. California poppies, cream cups and goldfields spread like carpets up to the summit.

SUNDAY, May 6 - 8:30 am, Lead by Sally Snipes. Volcan/5 Oaks Trail. Meet at the Trailhead sign on Farmers Road. Free shuttle van leaves Town Hall at 8:15 am. See description above.

VMF'S EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Visible from the Pacific coastline 60 miles away, majestic Volcan Mountain is the dominant scenic feature not only in Julian, but also for a significant portion of San Diego's backcountry. As the headwaters for three San Diego rivers, and the last stronghold for some rare plant and animal species, protecting and preserving Volcan Mountain's ecological diversity is essential to San Diego's future. This is the challenge to which the Volcan Mountain Foundation (VMF) rises through its mission to preserve Volcan Mountain for future generations through the conservation and acquisition of land, practice of respectful stewardship, environmental education, public outreach, and resource management.

The proceeds of the Julian Wild and Scenic Film Festival directly support VMF's education program. Led by environmental educator extraordinaire Kathleen Beck, VMF's education programs teach kids to understand and appreciate nature. As an outdoor classroom one cannot ask for a better place to learn than on guided school hikes, the "Kids with Cameras" program, a wildlife tracking workshop, or the many other educational programs offered by VMF on Volcan Mountain. ABOUT THE WILD AND SCENIC FILM FESTIVAL

The Wild & Scenic Film Festival was started in 2003 by the South Yuba River Citizens League (SYRCL, pronounced "circle"), a watershed advocacy group based in the Sierra foothills of Northern California. The organization was formed in 1983 when a small group of concerned citizens banded together to fight against several proposed dams. The festival's namesakes in celebration of achieving Wild and Scenic status on 39 miles of the South Yuba River in 1999. The festival celebrates its annual event in Nevada City, CA, each winter featuring over 100 award-winning films and welcoming filmmakers, celebrities, and activists who bring a human face to the environmental movement. SYRCL's Wild & Scenic Film Festival is a call to action! The films illustrate not only the challenges facing our planet but the work communities are doing to protect the environment and the places we love. The stories give us a sense of place and what it means to be responsible stewards of the earth.

Once the curtain closes in Nevada City, SYRCL shares their success with other organizations nationwide by packaging the 3-day event into a touring festival which visits over 100 communities nationwide. The tour is building a grassroots network of organizations connected by a common goal of using film to inspire activism. The festival's six National Partners: Clif Bar, Patagonia, Osprey Packs, Sierra Nevada Brewing Company, and Mother Jones have joined together to support this campaign. They help to bring these inspiring and provocative films to communities across the country. Enjoy the festival!

Julian is in the spotlight. Our wonderful community is host to the first ever Wild and Scenic Film Festival, May 4-6, 2012. 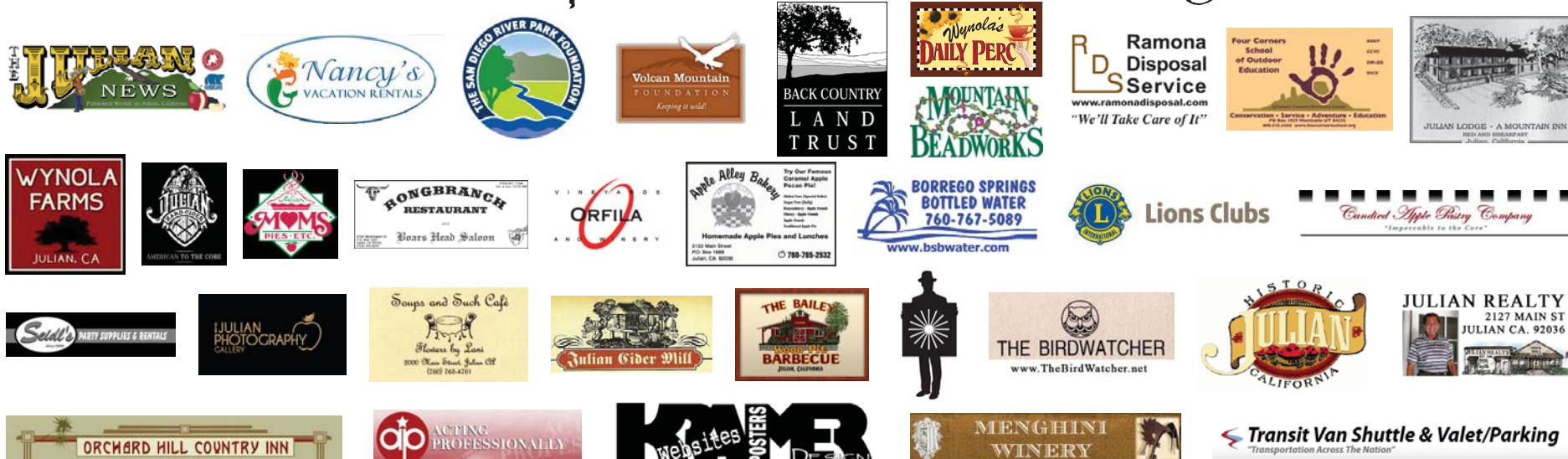
